# 1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL

Meeting called to order at approximately 6:01PM. Roll call was conducted by the Chair.

#### 4. PRESENTATION

Brian Staebell, the Chief Deputy District Attorney presented on issues of human trafficking in Sonoma County. Labor trafficking and pimping and pandering are the two major human trafficking issues that Sonoma County face. He started off his presentation with sharing different perspectives that people have about human trafficking. He then shared examples of cases he and his office encounter and have prosecuted. Brian Staebell ended his presentations with providing resources and name of organizations that can help individuals in human trafficking situations.
