Levi's GranFondo 2022

Description:

Levi's GranFondo 2022 will consist of five routes of varying difficulty starting and finishing in Windsor, CA. The ride will be limited to 2000 riders. The routes this year emphasize North County. The Growler and Gran routes will take riders out King Ridge and back in on Skaggs Springs roads. The long routes merge with the shorter Geysers and Medio routes in Cloverdale, with the Growler and Geysers going over Geysers Road and the Gran and Medio returning via Hwy 128.

Road Closures:

For all routes, closures of the following roads are requested from 7:30am to 8:30 am in order to safely release all riders: (Distance and expected active times indicated)

- Windsor River Road between Windsor Rd. and Starr Road (0.7 miles, 7:30 – 8:10)
- Starr Road between Windsor River Road and Mark West Station Road (3.2 miles, 7:30 – 8:20)
- Mark West Station Road between Starr Road and Trenton-Healdsburg Road (1.4 miles, 7:30 – 8:20)
- Trenton-Healdsburg Road between Mark West Station Road and Eastside Road (0.1 miles, 7:45 – 8:23)
- Eastside Road between Trenton-Healdsburg Road and Wohler Road (1.2 miles, 7:47 – 8:30)
- Wohler Road between Eastside Road and Westside Road (1.0 mile, 7:42 – 8:40)
- West Side Rd. from Wohler Rd. to River Rd. (3 miles, 7:55 – 8:40)

Growler and Gran route will proceed west on River Road from Westside Rd. CHP will provide a rolling break and hold traffic at SR116, Armstrong Woods Rd. and D St. in Monte Rio just long enough for most riders to pass. No traffic closures are planned for east bound traffic. Any temporary closures on River Road should last for only a few minutes. West bound traffic will be delayed by the cyclists. The objective is to get cyclists down River Road as expeditiously as possible and onto Cazadero Hwy.

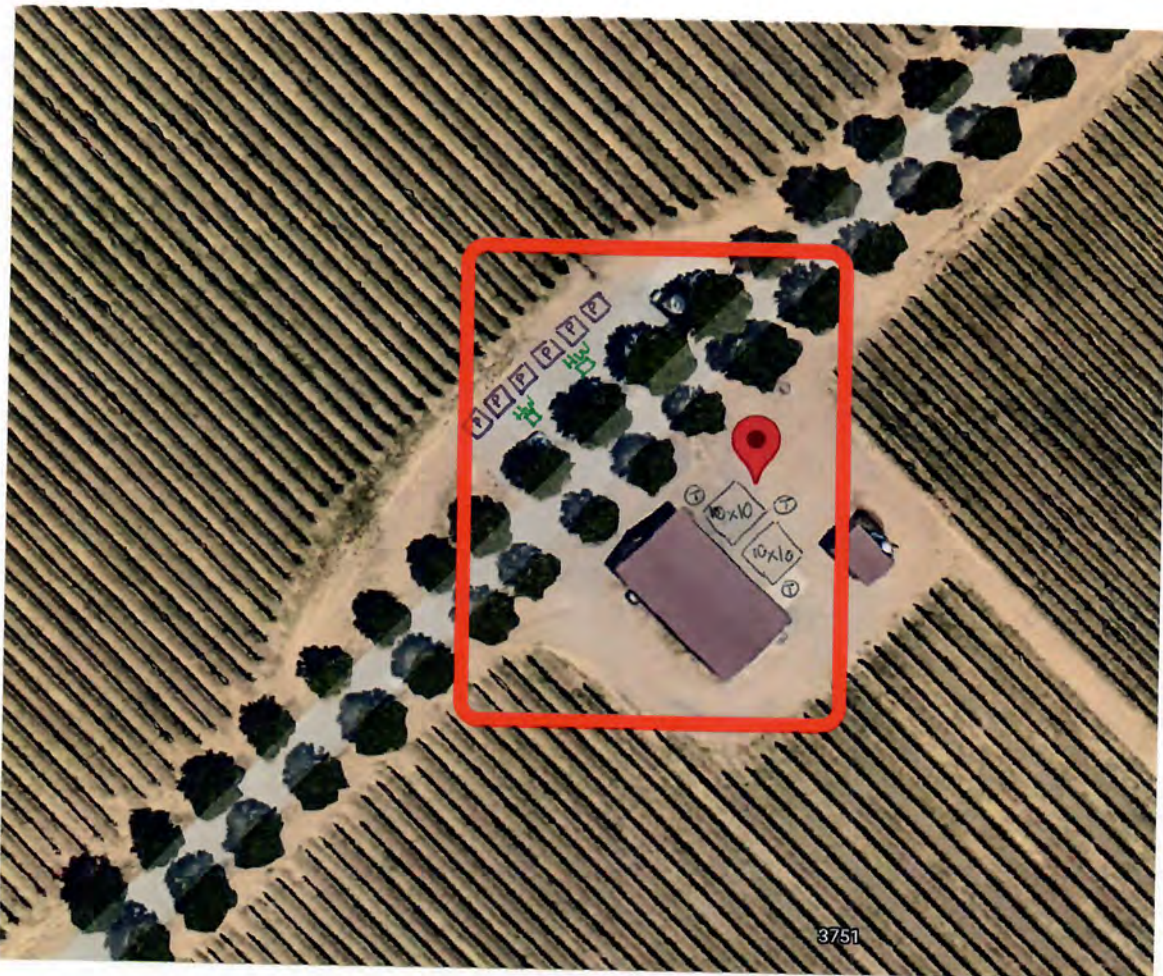

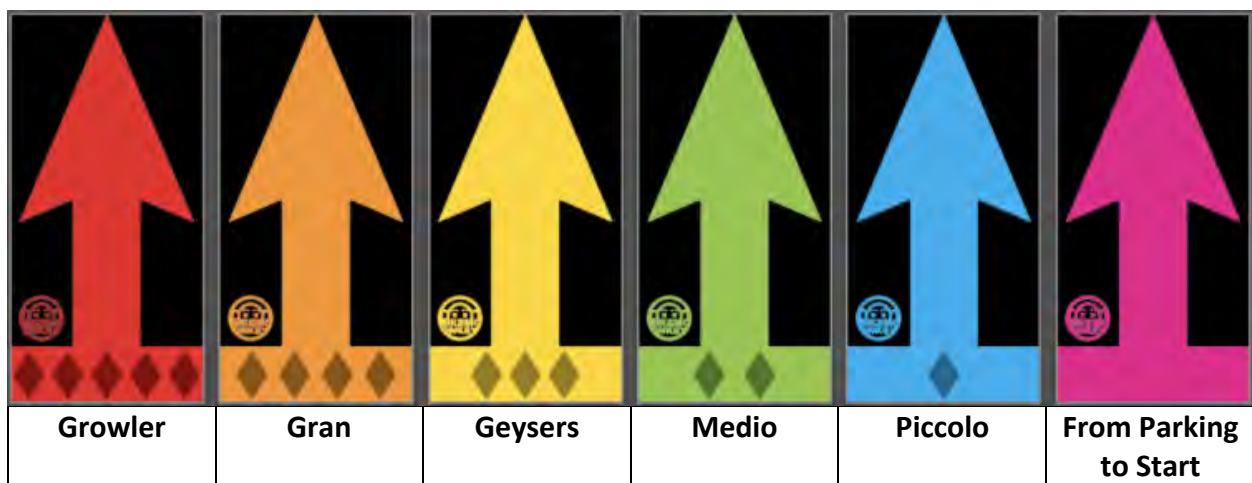

Levi's GranFondo 2022 Course Marking Plan

Purpose: Provide directional signage for participants in the Levi's GranFondo (LGF) bike ride. Course markings are provided to indicate course direction at intersections, course hazards such as: steep down hills, rough roads, and cattle guards, and approaching aid stations.

Markers: Bike Monkey utilizes reusable course markers placed on plastic stakes or attached to existing structures where allowed.

Route specific markings are color coded to indicate routes, for example a long route may be red and short route blue. Information signs are blue and warning signs are either yellow or red.



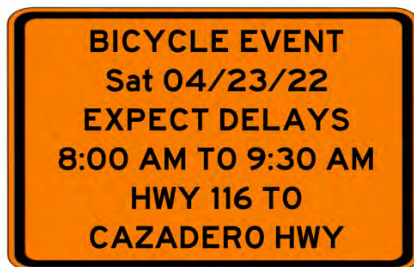
The LGF will have a total of 5 routes. In the event of either manmade or natural hazards, such as fire or flood, abbreviated routes will be designated for those impacted.

Timing: Signs will be posted on April 21 & 22, 2022 between 0600 and 1800. An advance team will inspect the course for missing or mutilated signs on April 23, 2022 prior to riders starting the course to remark as necessary and recover damaged signs.

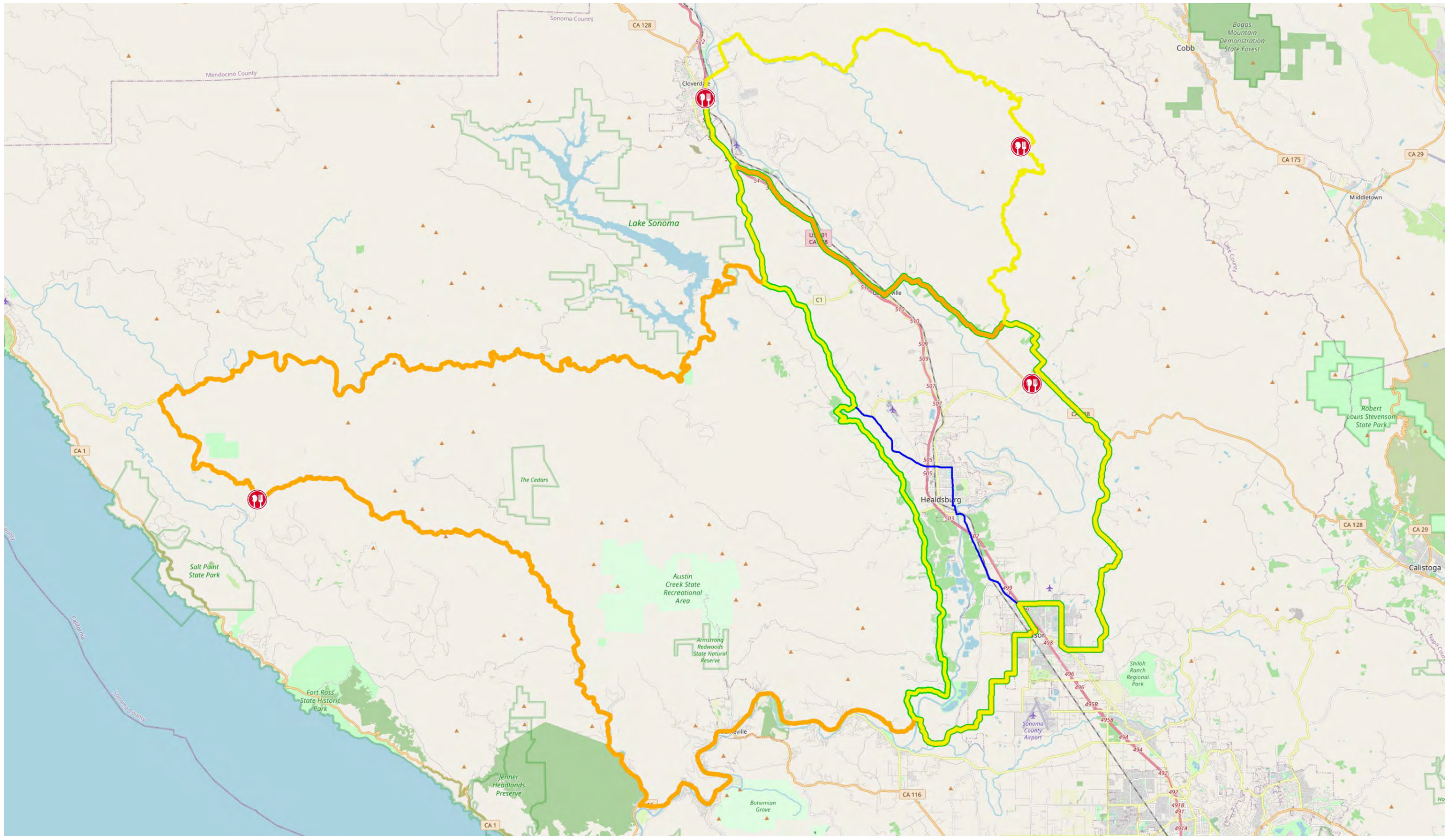

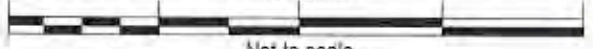
