County Counsel's Impartial Analysis of Measure B	Argument in Favor of Measure B
<p>The Timber Cove Fire Protection District ("District") is governed by a Board of Directors ("Board"). The District is authorized by state law to provide fire protection services. Since the formation of the District in 1996, it has been governed by a Board with three directors. State law authorizes an increase in the number of directors on the Board if a majority of voters in the District who vote on the measure approve. The Board has determined this increase would be in the best interest of the District and its residents, and enacted a resolution calling a special election for voters to determine if the number of directors shall be increased from three (3) to five (5). This means a quorum is two. Directors are often stymied in discussing and researching issues outside a board meeting because of sunshine laws when a quorum is reached. Making the workings of the board transparent to the community is a good thing, but over-hampering research and discovery work is a burden.</p> <p>The work of the board has increased beyond what three directors can handle.
