#### 5. OFFICER REPORTS AND ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATES

- a. Chair Blalock reported on the budget increase for the commission that HR has proposed to the BOS. She invited everyone to reach out to their Supervisors to encourage the budget increase.
- b. Chair Blalock reported on having a booth for the Sonoma County Pride on June 4<sup>th</sup> from 11am-5pm. She invited commissioners to participate and will also invite the Jr. Commission to attend.
- c. The Commission will be tabling at the Wednesday Night Market on August 24, 2022. Discussion on expanding outreach in other cities and on the materials being handed out.
- d. Chair Blalock reminded the commission to think of new ad hocs.
- e. Staff reported on the new website. She invited the commissioners to explore the website especially on their ad hocs and to provide her with editing suggestions.

- a. CSW Monthly Radio Project reported that they boosted a video on childcare that was created last year.
- b. Impact of Covid-19 on Women in the Workforce Ad Hoc will follow a bill that relates to food insecurity-SB744. The ad hoc will be sponsoring 4cs 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary-Champion for Children Event. They gave Parent Voices \$1,500 to help with their leadership and advocacy program. Also reported that Athena house is shutting down due to funding and Vice Chair Wood invited everyone to get involved to write letters, voice their concerns, reach out to the BOS and protest.

- c. The Junior Commission on the Status of Women had their graduation. Some Supervisors attended and were very impressed with the projects. Ask for Angela project was in the Press Democrat. Next cohort will have 22 participants.
- d. Spirit Award Ad Hoc has secured judges except for the 5<sup>th</sup> District. July 1<sup>st</sup> will be the launch. Commissioner Cruz nominated Lisa Hinton.
