## WHAT IS SONOMA CONNECT | SONOMA UNIDOS?

Sonoma Connect | Sonoma Unidos is an open coalition of partners and community members working together to create a comprehensive equity-focused and trauma-informed network that allows people to connect to resources they need to thrive.

### THE PROBLEM WE ARE TRYING TO SOLVE

In spite of having numerous and diverse resources in Sonoma County, many are hard to find, hard to access, and not connected with each other. Social systems often work in silos, are not coordinated, and thus are not person-centered. This means people experience having to tell their story multiple times, and may not receive services that are coordinated and aligned with their needs. What we see is underutilized services and services that are not culturally responsive or effective with all populations. The result is the inability to prevent complex health and social problems such as adverse childhood experiences (ACEs).

### HOW WE ARE TRYING TO SOLVE IT

Sonoma Connect | Sonoma Unidos uses a collective impact framework to bring together resource providers, service providers, and community members to prevent, address and heal ACEs and other social determinants of health (SDOH) through leveraging, alignment and agreement on common goals. We do this work through Action Teams grounded in an anti-racist, trauma-informed framework that centers community voice to drive changes to address fragmentation of resources. The Action Teams are open to everyone, and are designed to encourage active participation of people who want to work together on that Team's agenda.

### ACTION TEAMS

#### **ACE Screening Clinical Implementation**

Considers and implements how to build on best practices for ACE screenings, education and responsive support where needed in Sonoma County. The current focus of this action team is on how health centers can partner with schools, community-based organizations, and government agencies to integrate medical and social health. Health centers, schools and community-based organizations currently attend.

#### **Resource Connect Network**

Working to build a sustainable medical and social system integration tool using technology to connect existing platforms wherever possible. The platform will support comprehensive high quality resources that support, communication, referrals and shared case management between organizations.

#### **Community Accountability**

Ensures that Sonoma Connect | Sonoma Unidos addresses racism and social inequities. This action team works to uplift community voices and support pathways to leadership for BIPOC communities in the county. The Community Accountability Action team supports building and fostering a system of authentic community engagement by connecting to existing efforts, and supporting local leaders.

#### **Neighborhood Resource Centers**

Focuses on the people and places that make a resource connection system work: community health workers (CHW's) and neighborhood resource centers (NRCs). This action team develops standards of practice to build workforce capacity for CHW's and NRC's. The NRC action team provide trauma-informed support and referrals and close service gaps.



## OVERSIGHT

The Incubation Team provides oversight and accountability of start-up efforts of the initiative. A broader governing community board is developing to govern and direct the work of Sonoma Connect | Sonoma Unidos.

It is not a legal entity, but a collaborative that is supported by many stakeholders to bring community together to support a common agenda and achieve common goals.
