Subject: Sonoma County 2020 Consolidated Plan Action Plan: One-Year Use of Funds for Fiscal

Year (FY) 2024-25 of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG), and Low- and Moderate-Income Housing Asset Fund (LMIHAF) Funds and a Substantial Amendment to the FY 2021-2022 Action Plan for HOME American Rescue Plan (HOME-ARP) Funds

The Sonoma County Community Development Commission (SCCDC) staff prepared a draft Action Plan for FY 2024-25, and a Substantial Amendment to the Action Plan for FY 2021-22 based on the CDBG, HOME, ESG, and HOME-ARP funding recommendations, approved by the Community Development Committee (CD Committee) and the Cities and Towns Advisory Committee (CTAC) on February 14, 2024. The committees also approved the recommended \$250,000 in funding awards for the Low-and Moderate-Income Housing Asset Fund.

The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires submission of the Annual Action Plans by May 15, 2024, to enable the "Urban County" entitlement jurisdiction to receive CDBG, HOME, ESG, and HOME-ARP grant funding. The Action Plans list the specific projects that are being approved for a combined total of \$3,474,710 from these funding sources, in addition to \$250,000 of LMIHAF funds. These funds can be used for affordable housing development and preservation, public facilities and improvements, rental assistance, emergency shelter operations, and services related to fair housing, homelessness prevention, case management, and financial stability, all to benefit lower-income residents, as well as administrative costs for SCCDC staff to operate these HUD-funded programs.

The following table includes the combined total of CDBG, HOME, ESG, HOME-ARP, and LMIHAF funding recommended to support the activities listed in the draft FY 2024-25 Action Plan and the FY 2021-22 Amended Action Plan.

The draft FY 2024-25 Action Plan and Substantial Amendment to the FY 2021-22 Action Plan were prepared for a 30-day comment period, as required by HUD. The comment period started on February 16, 2024, and concluded on March 18, 2024. Following the public comment period and the recommendation of the CD Committee and CTAC, the draft Action Plans will go to the Board of Supervisors for approval on April 30, 2024, and the Board of Commissioners will consider the recommendations for the LMIHAF funds (Successor Agency authorization).

Requested Action: Staff is requesting that the committees make a recommendation for the Board of Supervisors' approval of the FY 2024-25 Action Plan and Substantial Amendment to the FY 2021-22 Action Plan and approval of the funding recommendations of LMIHAF by the Board of Commissioners. In addition, because HUD has not yet published the FY 2024-25 CDBG, HOME, and ESG allocations for entitlement jurisdictions, staff requests that the committees make recommendations for adjustments to the award amounts listed above in the event that a higher or lower level of funding is made available to the Urban County, based on the percentage of each fund source and recommended award amount.
