### Call to Order

Casey McChesney called the meeting to order at 12:37 pm and introductions were made.

### Meeting Minutes

Minutes from January 2018 were available for the group to review, but the group could not vote to approve them at this time. The meeting agenda for February 2018 was sent out to the public with an incorrect date remaining from last month. Therefore, the meeting did not meet the Brown Act requirement of public announcement 72 hours in advance. The vote will be deferred until the March meeting.

### Discussion:

Norma Doyle, introduced Michele Rogers, ED Early Learning Institute.

### State Legislature Updates

Ed Sheffield reported that with the present recess in State legislators there is nothing specific to report.

Annie Nicols asked for comment on how the federal budget and tax changes might impact on the MCAH focus that the board members provide. Ed stated that because changes are still

being proposed for the federal budget that he has no accurate analysis about specific changes available at this time. Ms. Nicols also asked for any clarity on DACA deadlines and Ed stated that with over 100 law suits now initiated on Trumps proposed changes (including DACA, offshore drilling, etc.) that many actions will be challenged and delayed. California’s Attorney General is working on California’s agenda to prevail on many of the issues (as are many A.G.s from other states) and many deadlines have not been finalized on the proposed changes. Melanie Dodson asked about rising problems for Child Care providers impacted by the fires. Many have requested location changes under emergency waivers but the emergency status recently closed, so permission has been denied. Ed suggested Melanie refer such occurrences to him and he will help direct individual child care providers to staff who will help them gain approval needed.

Norma Doyle stated that she had requested Ed try to find out if AB340, which sets up advisory group to find a way for trauma-informed care and ACES screening be incorporated into EPSDT screening. His inquiry through Government Affairs in Dept. of Health Care Services and a Legislative Coordinator who worked on AB 340 said there is potentially “much to discuss” on the implementation of this bill but unfortunately further communications must be delayed until next week. This Friday 2/1/18 is the deadline for legislation introduced last year to leave their house of origin and this issue must be delayed for now.

**Staff Report**

Norma Doyle reported that Karyna Mayora-Linzer, will return to work mid-March 2018. Additionally, MCAH staff are inquiring at local clinics about the education and support needed to incorporate trauma-informed care and screening for ACES in EPSDT screening at a future time. An inquiry into the Family Practice residency program stated that they have begun screening and that their Pediatric Medical Director, Mark Sloan, M.D. and former director have done a lot of this work already. Another inquiry from MCAH staff to Pediatric Medical Director Deirdre Bernard-Pearl, MD at the Santa Rosa Community Health Clinic resulted in a current planning effort with MCAH for an overall training update for all staff and more focused training for those who are doing the hands-on care.

Safe Sleep Risk Reduction education is being offered by MCAH staff to some local community-based organizations focused in substance abuse recovery, and one training has recently been scheduled at Sloan House.

Child Death Review Team (CDRT) will have a new coordinator, Renée Alger. Due to further drowning deaths at Goat Rock the team suggested working with the State to upgrade signage that imparts the high level of danger and the continuing deaths, similar to signage seen at a state-wide beach elsewhere.
