2. Public Comment for Items Not on the Agenda

3. Approval of Minutes for January 20, 2021 CD Committee meeting CD Committee did not have quorum. Deferred vote.

5. Interim Executive Director's Report

Ken Tasseff, Health Care Privacy and Security Officer for the Sonoma County Department of Health Services, presented about the vaccine rollout. He reported about vaccine site locations as well as number of doses administered to date. Approximately 18% of county residents over age 16 had received the vaccine as of this meeting.  a) Update by Tina Rivera, Assistant Director, that the Board of Supervisors approved the County Fund for Housing Allocations on Feb 2, 2021. Upcoming funding opportunities are CDBG-DR and CDBG NOFAs coming up in April. Jenna Garcia requested timeline deadlines for CDBG funding. Tina Rivera will bring this information to both committees.

Members requested a copy of Associate Director Rivera's CFH spreadsheet.

b) CTAC requested that CDBG-CV funding allocations prioritize the Urban County. HUD confirmed that these funds need to provide rental assistance primarily in the Urban







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County and not in Santa Rosa and Petaluma as entitlement jurisdictions that have their own funding. CDBG-CV funding will only be used in the Urban County/non-entitlement jurisdictions. A coordinated response of entitlement and non-entitlement jurisdictions may be worked out locally.

CTAC requested a spreadsheet of providers administering the rental assistance program.

c) Updates on new State and Federal housing funds

Rohish Lal, Legislative Policy and External Affairs Officer, provided an update on this item. SB91 was approved to use \$2.6 billion in federal funds to pay landlords 80% of rent for qualifying tenants with COVID-related rent and utility financial issues.

HUD is evaluating actions taken by previous administration that affected Fair Housing policies and laws. 6. Report on new Federal Emergency Rental Assistance Program Funds

New funding is available from the US Dept. of Treasury to stabilize households and forestall evictions. Funding can also be used to pay utilities. The County received \$14.7 million. Cities and County are distributing these funds throughout the county. 10% is available to service providers; 90% must be used for rental/utility assistance.

The County will also receive \$15 million from CDBG. Cities and County will strategize together on the best way to administer this program. These funds need to be spent by the end of the 2021 calendar year.

Funds are available to pay off rent and utilities in arrears as well as for up to one year as well as for future rent and utility costs. Payments go directly to landlords or the utility company. Either the landlord or the tenant can apply, but not both. State funds require landlords forgive 20% of owed rent.

CDC leaders will be meeting with all jurisdictions in the County to discuss collaborating on this program to ensure the people most in need are reached with these funds.







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7. Approval of City of Healdsburg Request for HOME/HEAP Funds Budget Modification

Steven Sotomayor, City of Healdsburg, recused himself for this item.

The City of Healdsburg requested to utilizing HOME funds to offset increased construction costs for building a Navigation Center at Victory Apartments, a project funded with HEAP dollars. This is a budget modification request, not a request for additional funds.

CTAC voted to support the modification.

The CD Committee did not have a quorum, so a special meeting will be set up within 72 hours.
