FY 20-21 Scope

- □ In June 2020, the CCP approved \$104,250 for the FY 20-21 evaluation budget
- The Probation Department will independently fund the Probation Supervision Process Evaluation and is open to supporting additional activities
- To decide: Which activities should be funded?
 - Reentry Assessment
 - Racial/Ethnic Disparities Assessment
 - Research and Planning to Address Program Barriers
 - Jail Programs Process and Outcome Evaluation



Reentry Assessment

- Evaluate Sonoma County's reentry system and assist the County in building an evidence-based reentry system focusing on:
 - system coordination
 - skilled/trained professionals
 - evidence-based decision-making
 - treatment and supportive services
- □ Fully-loaded budget: \$76,642



Racial/Ethnic Disparities Assessment

- Determine the extent to which racial/ethnic disparities exist within Sonoma County's criminal justice system across different decision-making points
- □ Fully-loaded budget: \$59,907



Research & Planning to Address Program Barriers

- Identify strategies to address barriers that impede program implementation and effectiveness that have been highlighted through the program-level evaluations
- Conduct a literature review of best and promising practices
- Engage Sonoma County Stakeholders to develop an implementation plan to address the barriers
- □ Fully-Loaded Budget: \$37,361



Jail Programs Process and Outcome Evaluations

- Assess programs' implementation and impact
 - alignment with best practices
 - utilization of services and service capacity
 - coordination between providers and justice agencies
 - data capacity and technical assistance
- □ Programs:
 - Starting Point only:
 - Fully-loaded budget: \$50,589
 - Starting Point + other jail programs: Workforce preparation classes, alternatives to violence workshop, education over obstacles, and library and literacy programs
 - Fully-loaded budget: \$70,556
