They then will be transferred to a predetermined meeting room designated by the Sonoma County Department of Transportation and Public Works where they will be publicly opened and read aloud by the Sonoma County Director of Transportation and Public Works or her designee. The Sonoma County Director of Public Works will review the bids and refer the bids to the Board of Supervisors to consider awarding the project within 60 days of bid opening.

At the time this contract awarded, the Contractor shall possess a Hazardous Substance Removal Certification and a Class A license.

General Work Description: The work to be done consists, in general, of constructing two public parking lots, roadway entrances and a multipurpose path along the railroad tracks. This work will be the first phase of the construction of a complete commuter train station, which will be performed after this project is completed and operational.

This project will entail: tree removal, clearing and grubbing, demolition of pavement and concrete curb/gutter, asphalt concrete paving, Portland cement pavement removal and abandonment of storm drainage and water main, storm drainage construction , water main construction sanitary sewer construction underground electric construction, curb ramps, curb and gutter construction, pavement stripping, sign placement, parking lot lighting, trail lighting, landscaping, railroad track and switch removal and reconstruction of a portion of mainline track, precast concrete dry interlocking retaining wall construction, and such other items or details, not mentioned above, that are required by the plans, Standard Specifications, and Special Provisions shall be performed, placed, constructed or installed.

The successful bidder shall furnish both a performance bond for the full amount of the contract and a payment bond in accordance with California Civil Code Section 3247, as set forth in the Instructions to Bidders.

The County of Sonoma hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, sex, national origin or other prohibited basis in consideration for an award.

Liquidated damages in the amount of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) will be assessed for each and every calendar days delay in finishing the work in excess of the number of working days prescribed in the contract.

Pursuant to Section 1770 and following of the Labor Code, the general prevailing rate of wages has been determined by the Director of the California Department of Industrial Relations. Bidders should contact the Department of Industrial Relations at (415) 703-4774 for General Prevailing Wage Rates on specific job classifications. Future effective wage rates which have been predetermined are on file with the California Department of Industrial Relations and are referenced but not printed in the General Prevailing Wage Rates. Bidders are advised that if they intend to use a craft or classification not on file

on the general wage determinations, they may be required to pay the wage rate of that craft or classification most closely related to it as shown in the general determinations.

Pursuant to Section 1773 and following of the Labor Code, the general prevailing rate of wages in the county, or counties, in which the work is to be done has been determined by the Director of the California Department of Industrial Relations.
