Funding/Evaluation Committee Scope:

At our 1st non-orientation meeting (September 8, 2022), we will discuss Committee scope and charter. Concepts may include, but not be limited to:

- Advise/recommend CoC Board on short and long-term funding strategies that support identified Homeless System of Care goals
- Help design, maintain and continuously improve the Continuum of Care's:
 - SYSTEM (the whole system of care)
 - PROGRAMS (i.e. rapid-rehousing programs, emergency shelter programs, permanent supportive housing programs, etc.
 - PROVIDERS (our partnering service providers who implement programs)
- Identify data sets that effectively evaluate outcomes
- Work with the HMIS Lead to design for committee use and public-facing disclosure
- Ensure identified data uses an equity lens so that outcomes lead to an equitable distribution of resources
- Orient committee members as to the relevance and use of data that best support recommendations
- Collaborate as needed with CoC committees charged with oversight of system-level, program-specific, and provider-level compliance and local strategic targets
- Provide feedback to the HMIS Committee regarding the annual evaluation process of the HMIS Lead

What you can expect as a member

- Committee leadership group will debrief after each meeting to discuss committee engagement, our process and adjusted expectations
- An agenda packet distribution goal of posting the agendas and distributing materials the weekend before the Thursday meeting (this is workload dependent, and some materials may lag)
- We'll present data sets at each meeting to orient committee members as to how to utilize HMIS and local data
- We'll provide relevant mini glossaries and legends as needed to buttress the overall glossary.

Homeless Data Links for Reference

Annual Homeless Census and Surveys

These are the point in time count reports conducted annually and usually in the last 10 days of January. They contain details and in-depth analysis of the the sheltered and unsheltered homeless families and individuals experiencing homelessness on the night of the count.

Permanent Housing Performance Dashboard

This dashboard shows permanent housing and return to homelessness rates. You can set date parameters and filter by program type, homeless service provider, or individual programs.

System Performance Measures Reports

The System Performance Measures are seven key measures that all CoCs must report to HUD annually. Measures include The Length of Time Persons Remain Homeless, The Extent to which Persons who Exit Homelessness to Permanent Housing Destinations Return to Homelessness, Employment and Income Growth for Homeless Persons in CoC Program-funded Projects, Number of Persons who Become Homeless for the First Time, and Successful Placement from Street Outreach and Successful Placement in or Retention of Permanent Housing. Longitudinal Systems Analysis Reports (STELLA)

These are print outs from HUDs STELLA system. The Stella Performance Module provides dynamic visuals of CoCs' Longitudinal Systems Analysis (LSA) data to illustrate how households move through the homeless system, and to highlight outcome disparities. Homeless Data Integration System (HDIS)

This is a state run platform that has some core metrics that can be viewed by community or at the state level. Information includes racial disparities, demographics, and number of people who experience homelessness in more than one California CoC. Data is fed into this system quarterly.
