



NORTHWEST SANTA ROSA

A *Portrait of Sonoma County* identifies as a priority area eight tracts to the north of Highway 12 that straddle Highway 101 in Santa Rosa that have human development index scores that range from 3.50 to a bit over 4.00, which are typical of the country in the early 1990s. The neighborhoods of West End, Bicentennial Park, Downtown Santa Rosa, Comstock, Burbank Gardens, West Junior College, Coddington, and Railroad Square, all of which are among the twenty lowest-scoring tracts, together represent a large area of concentrated disadvantage.









